ABORIGINAL HISTORY AND CULTURE



Kaya Wandjoo, nidja Bindjareb Noongar Kaadadjan (hello, welcome and learn from the Bindjareb people of the Noongar nation). The first people of the region were the Bindjareb people of the Noongar Nation, who named the locality Mandjoogordap (now Mandurah), which translates to 'meeting place of the heart'. You can learn the stories, secrets and traditions of one of the oldest surviving cultures on earth on an Aboriginal history and culture tour, at significant sites and art galleries. CRABBING



Blue swimmer crabs are native to Mandurah, and the Peel-Harvey Estuary is renowned for its excellent crabbing. The crabbing season starts 1st December and the best time to catch them is any time from then on through to March. You can go crabbing on a boat or jetty using drop nets or wade into shallow waters with scoop nets. Boats are available for hire locally or you can join a guided tour. You don't need a licence to catch crabs, however there are seasonal, size and bag limit regulations. The city celebrates this iconic local delicacy every year at Crab Fest in March.

LAKE CLIFTON THROMBOLITE REEF



Half an hour south of Mandurah, the thrombolites offer visitors a glimpse of what life was like when the earth began. Scientists believe that thrombolites are one of the first life forms on earth, dating back approximately 570 million years, producing oxygen that made all subsequent life possible. The Lake Clifton thrombolites are approximately 2,000 years old and the largest in the southern hemisphere. A boardwalk over the lake enables them to be viewed from above, with the best time to see them from January to May when the water levels are low.

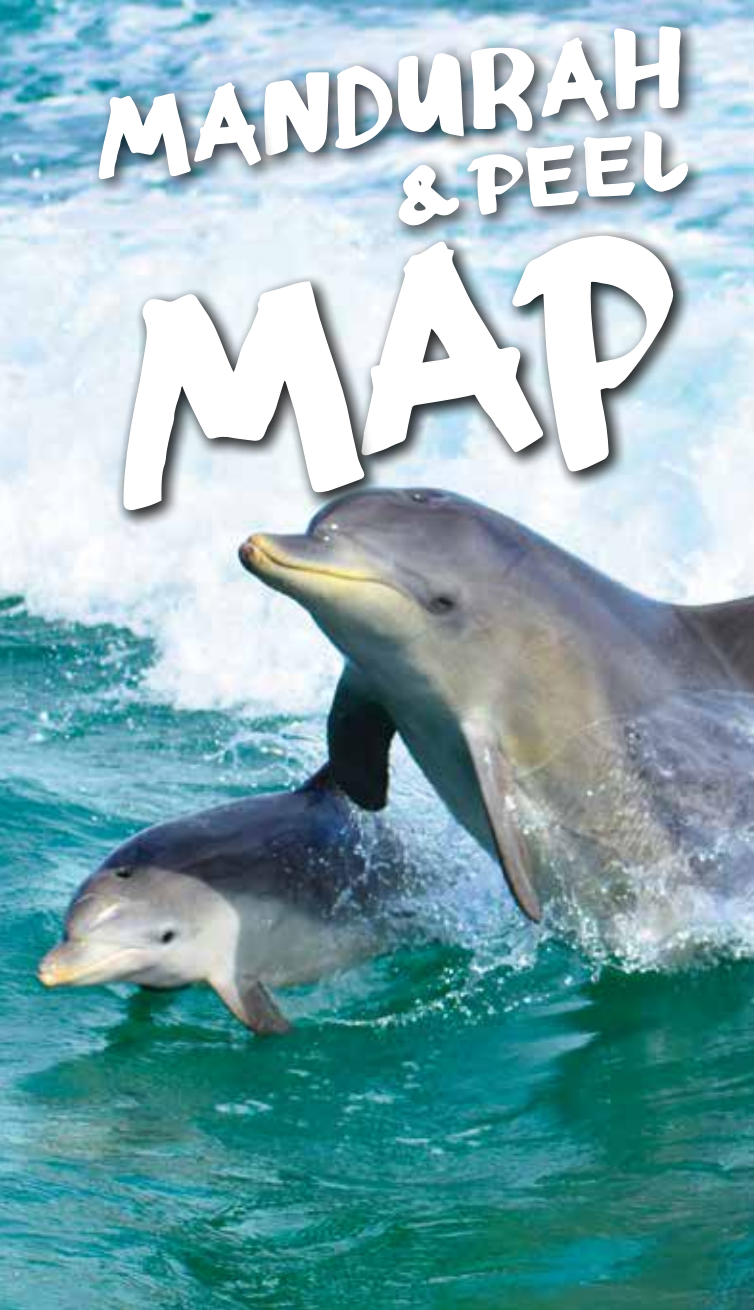

A BRIEF HISTORY



The first people to have inhabited the Mandurah region were the Binjareb people of the Noongar Nation, who named the locality Mandjogoodap, which translates as 'meeting place of the heart'. In 1828, Englishman Thomas Peel established a small settlement at the mouth of the Peel Harvey Estuary. The settlement was named after his wife, Elizabeth. The fishing village carved an existence from fishing, farming and canneries. In 1846, Western Australia's first mining operation was established at Yarrabrah (near present-day Mundijong), mining lead, silver and zinc. The Jarrahdale timber mill, established in May 1872, became the state's largest timber operation, and led to the development of service centres for the timber industry along the Perth-Picton railway line at Mundijong, Waroona and Dwellingup. In recent times, the timber industry has declined, but the establishment of alumina refineries at Pinjara and Wagerup, and gold mines at Boddington, have helped the local economy.

GETTING THERE



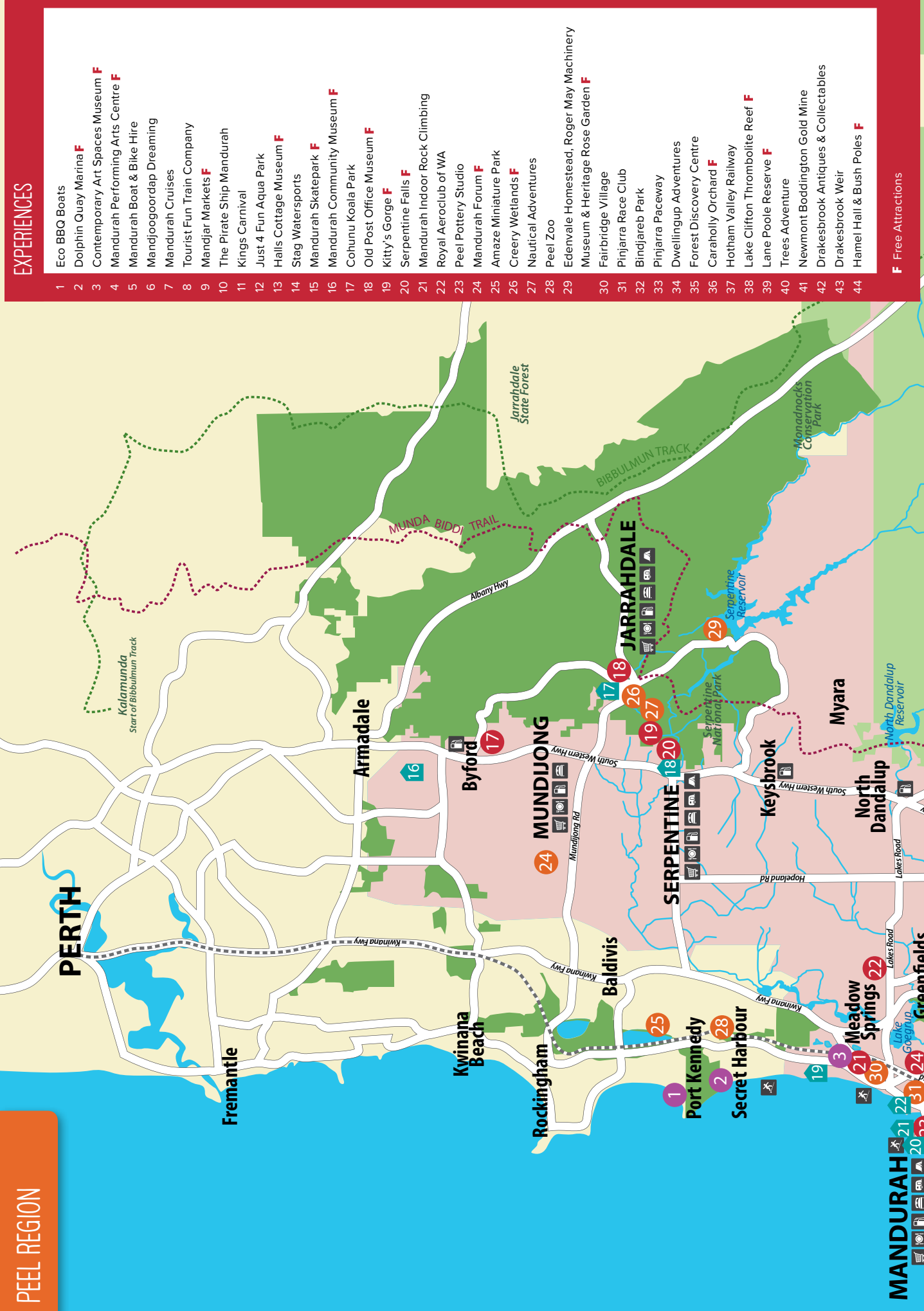
Mandurah is less than an hour's drive south of Perth via the Kwinana Freeway, exiting at Mandjogoodap Drive. Mandurah is a great base to explore the Peel Region, with most places within a 30 minute to one hour's drive. You will need a vehicle to get the most out of your visit, and there are a number of hire companies available. Transperth's Mandurah Line provides an affordable car rental. Transperth's Mandurah Line provides a regular fast train service between Perth and Mandurah. There are two departure stations in central Perth, and the underground and Elizabeth Quay. The journey takes just under an hour, departing every 10 to 15 minutes. Visit transperth.wa.gov.au for more information. For a different rail journey, consider taking the scenic inland route aboard the TransWA, stopping at 6 locations in the Peel Region. Visit www.transwawa.gov.au. Once in Mandurah, the city is very walkable with good paths, open spaces and waterside boardwalks. To explore further afield you also take a taxi or join a guided tour.

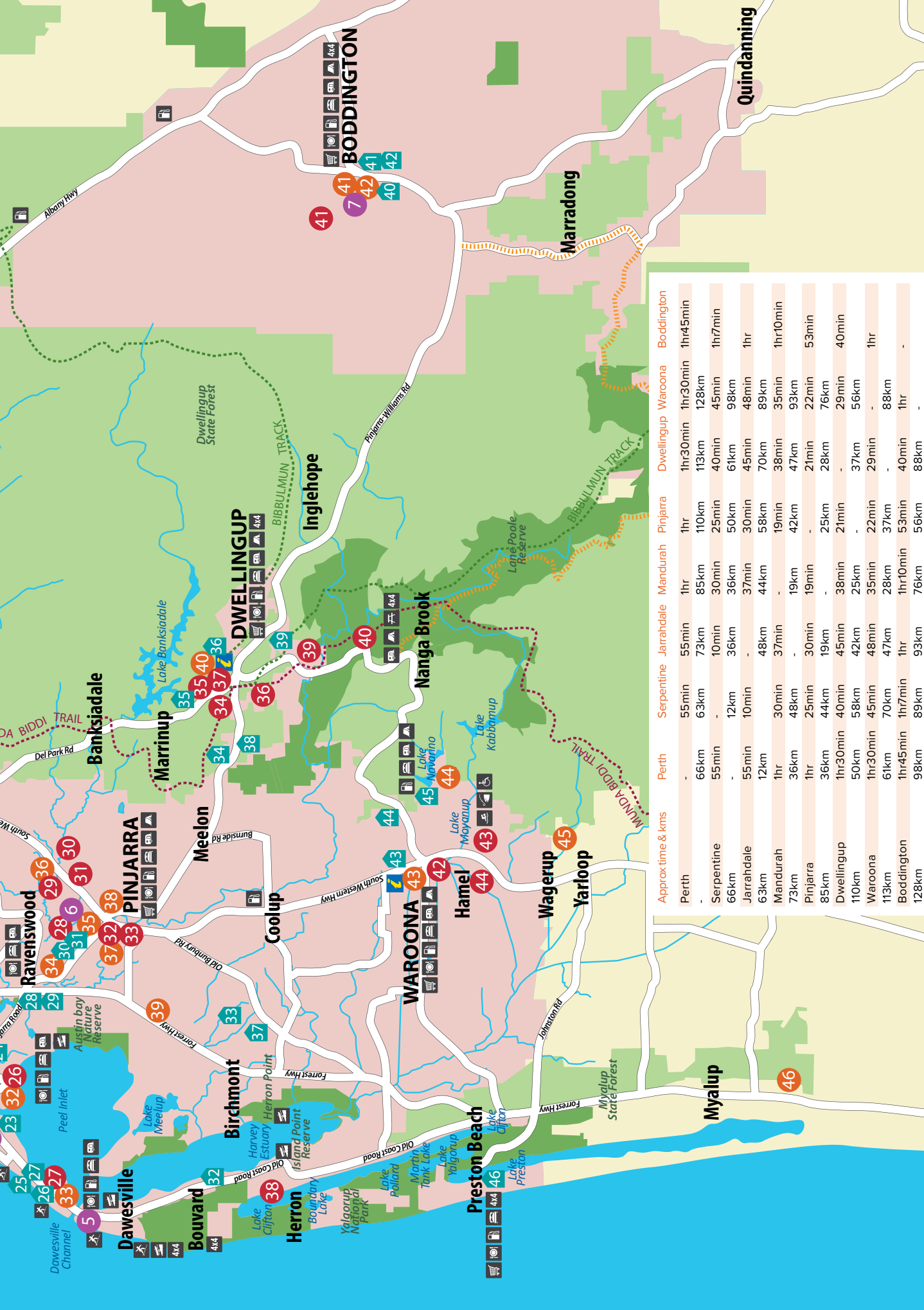
